We take a moment to reflect on Paul's words in Romans Chapter 8, verses 38 to 39: "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

These people already face a lack of water, food, and healthcare and some are homeless. We pray for those who work with them offering their practical help, energy and vision.

Heavenly Father, we pray for all those who have died in the faith of Christ.
